Multi-track P.I. work with a particular interest in brain and spinal injuries, amputee cases and injuries of the upmost severity. My practise is split as to about 75% Claimant and 25% Defendant work.

Throughout my career I have represented the Chief Constables of Merseyside, Manchester, Lancashire, Cheshire, North Wales, and occasionally the Isle of Man in civil actions brought by those seeking damages across the entire spectrum of torts, including claims brought by officers for injury on duty. Some of the more important cases include; *Weir v Chief Constable of Merseyside*, *Donachie v Chief Constable of Merseyside*, and *Daar v Chief Constable of Merseyside*.

Recent criminal trials have involved a conspiracy to murder and an historic sexual abuse case, in which the allegations dated back between 30 and 40 years and involved extremely serious allegations made by 5 siblings against their brother.

During my years as a junior I had extensive experience of both prosecuting and defending, and in silk wish to maintain that balance in serious criminal cases.
