DH (a minor) v Stockport NHS Foundation Trust (2018) – new born baby suffered a significant brain injury with life changing consequences following the negligent failure of staff at the Defendant hospital to arrange an urgent ultra sound scan. Liability, causation and quantum in dispute – likely value to exceed £10 million. Led by Bill Braithwaite QC;
