Cases

R v O'Reilly – death by careless driving - successful defence of driver in complex accident involving 2 pedestrians

R v Rosevere – death by dangerous driving by a man with a previous conviction for causing death by reckless driving

R v Sosinsi – financial penalty for dangerous driving (130mph+ on A-roads in a Porsche, followed by police motorcyclist)

R v Jakpa – provisional licence holder causing death of 4-year old child pedestrian by dangerous driving

R v Crennigan – car sales without Consumer Credit Licence and with false odometer readings (trading standards prosecution)

R v Ali – unlawful export of high-value Mercedes cars (prosecution by Department of Business, Innovation and Skills)

R v Wright – death by dangerous driving where the death was caused by stress, not collision

R v Lawrence – death by careless driving involving a cyclist and a HGV

R v Walsh – HGV driver causing death by dangerous driving after falling asleep at the wheel on the motorway.
